#### Itinerary I - 13 Days - Rates - Hotels

**Day One: Home City to Quito** Arrive Quito, colonial capital of Ecuador. Meeting service at the airport and transfer to your choice of hotel.

**Day Two: Quito City Tour** See the colonial center of Quito this morning including the carved facade of the House of Congress, the Presidential Palace and the Baroque style Church of La Compania with its gilded altars. Final stop is the art and crafts gallery of Tianquez. (B)

**Day Three: Quito to the Galapagos Islands** Fly 600 miles across the Pacific to the Galapagos Islands, and board your selected ship for a four-night adventure cruise. (**Note:**Galapagos cruises, airfare from Quito, air taxes and park fees are **NOT** included in the quoted tour rates. The **cruise rates are**

**Day Four to Day Six: Galapagos Cruise** Cruising the enchanted Galapagos Islands (B, L, D Daily)

**Day Seven: Galapagos Islands to Lima** Return flight to the Ecuador mainland and assistance with your air connection to Lima, Peru. Transfer to your choice of hotel (B)

**Day Eight: In Lima** Enjoy a tour of Lima, the City of Kings, combining the modern and colonial highlights and a visit to the world famous Museum of Anthropology and Archaeology, which will enhance your appreciation of pre-Inca and Inca cultures. (B)

**Day Nine: Lima/Cuzco/Urubamba Valley** An hour flight will transfer you to Cuzco, the ancient capital of the Inca Empire, at an altitude of 11,300 feet. You will be met upon arrival to commence your tour into the scenic Urubamba Valley. The valley, also known as the Sacred Valley of the Incas, is at a much more comfortable 8,500 feet, and you will immediately feel the difference. If you arrive Tuesday, Thursday, or Sunday, you will stop at Pisac for a colorful Indian market. Stalls overflow with weavings, handicrafts and pottery, enticing everyone to bargain! Later, climb the ruins at



Ollantaitambo, another sacred site which the Incas fiercely defended from the Spaniards. Overnight at your choice of charming country inns. (B, L)



**Day Ten: Urubamba Valley to Machu Picchu** Morning transfer to Ollantaitambo to board the train\* for Machu Picchu, where you will have a guided walking tour of the ruins. You and the lucky few who will spend the night here will have a few more hours to explore the site after the crowds have returned to Cuzco. Those who select the Deluxe or Deluxe Plus category hotels will enjoy an additional dinner. The **Sanctuary Lodge** (Deluxe Plus) is located just outside the gate to Machu Picchu at the top of the mountain. The other hotels are located in the quaint village of Machu Picchu Town at the base of the ruins. (B, L)

**Day Eleven: Machu Picchu to Cuzco**

The morning is free for you to revisit the ruins on your own. Return to Cuzco this afternoon by train for overnight at your hotel. **Note:** Transfers from Machu Picchu Town to/from Machu Picchu and entrance fees are **NOT** included this day. (B)



**Day Twelve: Cuzco Tour** This afternoon board your motorcoach for a tour of Colonial Cuzco, including the Temple of the Sun, Cathedral and Plaza de Armas. Visit Koricancha,



the Inca Sun Temple, and the church built right on top of the intact temple. Next, ascend the hills surrounding Cuzco to visit the Inca ruins of K'Kenko, Pucapucara, Tambo Machay and the great stone fortress, Sacsayhuaman. (B)

**Day Thirteen: Cuzco to Lima** Morning transfer to the airport, train or bus station for the continuation of your tour. **Note:** The tour may be extended to **Lake Titicaca and Bolivia**. (B)

## Itinerary II - 14 Days - Rates - Hotels

**Day One: Arrive Lima** Start your adventure into the Land of the Incas. Transfer to your selected hotel.

**Day Two: In Lima** Familiarize yourself with Lima on this half-day tour of the colonial highlights, followed by a visit to the **Archaeological Museum** for a chronological presentation of the many civilizations that flourished in Peru. Displays include important collections from the Chavin, Mochica, Chimu, and Nazca cultures. At the very end of the exhibit is a plaster-of-paris model of Machu Picchu, depicting it as it would have looked in Inca times. This is a great preparation for your trip. (B)

**Day Three: Lima/Cuzco/Urubamba Valley** An hour flight will transfer you to Cuzco, the ancient capital of the Inca Empire, at an altitude of 11,300 feet. You will be met upon arrival to commence your tour into the scenic Urubamba Valley. The valley, also known as the Sacred Valley of the Incas, is at a much more comfortable 8,500 feet, and you will immediately feel the difference. If you arrive Tuesday, Thursday, or Sunday, you will stop at Pisac for a colorful Indian market. Stalls overflow with weavings, handicrafts and pottery, enticing everyone to bargain! Later, climb the ruins at Ollantaitambo, another sacred site which the Incas fiercely defended from the Spaniards. Overnight at your choice of charming country inns. (B, L)



**Day Four: Urubamba Valley to Machu**

**Picchu** Morning transfer to Ollantaitambo to board the train\* for Machu Picchu, where you will have a guided walking tour of the ruins. You and the lucky few who will spend the night here will have a few more hours to explore the site after the crowds have returned to Cuzco. Those who select the Deluxe or Deluxe Plus category hotels will enjoy an additional dinner. The **Sanctuary Lodge** (Deluxe Plus) is located just outside the gate to Machu Picchu at the top of the mountain. The other hotels are located in the quaint village of Machu Picchu Town

at the base of the ruins. (B, L)

**Day Five: Machu Picchu to Cuzco** This morning you can revisit Machu Picchu on your own before the afternoon return train to Cuzco. **Note:** Transfers from Machu Picchu Town to/from Machu Picchu and entrance fees are **NOT** included this day. (B)

**Day Six: In Cuzco** Morning at leisure. In the afternoon, tour Cuzco, including the recently restored Cathedral and the Inca Sun Temple, Koricancha. Then ascend into the hills overlooking Cuzco to visit the massive stone fortress of Sacsayhuaman. You'll wonder how the Incas built this massive structure. Nearby, visit K'kenko, sacred Pucapucara and the temple of Tambo Machay. (B)

**Day Seven: Cuzco/Lima Quito** Morning flight to Lima, where you will be met and assisted with checking in for your connection flight to Quito, Ecuador. Meeting service upon arrival in Quito and transfer to your selected hotel. (B)



**Day Eight: Quito City Tour** See the colonial center of Quito this morning including the carved facade of the House of Congress, the Presidential Palace and the Baroque style Church of La Compania with its gilded altars. Final stop is the art and crafts gallery of Tianquez. (B)

**Day Nine: Quito to the Galapagos Islands** Fly 600 miles across the Pacific to the Galapagos Islands, and board your selected ship for a four-night adventure cruise.
